

Learned and Wise

Learning objectives:

- Describe what is meant by the Catholic virtues **learned** and **wise**
- Explain how we might practise these virtues
- Identify how others in our Archdiocese are being learned and wise

Learned: learning how God wants us to live our lives

Whether we are young or old, we should never stop learning about what God wants of us. We learn many new things each day. By reading the Bible, listening to our teachers and listening to our hearts, we learn more of what God wants.

Wise: knowing how God wants us to live our lives and putting it into practice.

God is always with us and hoping that we will live our lives in the right way, following the teachings of Jesus.

What qualities does God want us to show in our everyday lives?

He wants us to be kind, loving, respectful and trustworthy. He wants us to do as Jesus did.

Key stage 1: circle time

Ruby is setting up a game in the playground. She has invited everybody in her class to join in, except Sophie.

How do you think Sophie feels about this? (Discuss.)

What wiser choices could Ruby have made to stop Sophie feeling like this? (Discuss.)

God calls on us to be kind to everybody, even people who we don't like.

Ruby knew that the kind thing to do would have been to invite Sophie to play. But she didn't make a **wise** choice. She did not put her knowledge into practice like God wants her to.

Activity: draw a picture of everyone in your class playing a game together. Leave nobody out.

When we learn something in RE, do we actually practise it? We should use the knowledge that we have learned in RE just like we use maths when we go shopping. It should be part of our daily lives. Examples of how we practise learning from our RE lessons:

- Jesus commands us to, “Love one another, as I have loved you.” (John 15:12)
- “The people asked John, ‘then what shall we do?’ He answered, if you have two shirts, share with the person who does not have one. If you have food, share that also.” (Luke 3:10-11)
- We thank God – we pray daily in class.
- “Whenever you are able, do good to people who need help.” (Proverbs 3:27)
- “Generous people will be blessed because they share their food with the poor.” (Proverbs 22:9)

Key stage 2: activity 1

Using some or all of the examples below, in groups discuss and write down how these teachings can be applied in everyday life.

Key stage 2: activity 2

Key stage 2: activity 3

Read Matthew, 25:35-40

"I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was ill and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."

Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison and go to visit you?"

The King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

Which of Father Hudson's projects or services put into practice the message of this teaching?

Example answers:

"I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Brushstrokes reaches out to refugees.

"I was sick and you visited me." Volunteers befriend older people who cannot leave their homes.

- Lonely, older people
- The homeless
